A Study for establishment of Airport Surveillance Radar (ASR-11), Aeronautical Study Number 04-AEA-0133-NR, Clarksburg, West Virginia.

PROPOSAL: A Study to construct an Airport Surveillance Radar, ASR-11 at the Clarksburg Regional Airport, Clarksburg, West Virginia. This is known locally as Site # 4, located 2 miles northwest of the airport.

This structure does not exceed airport obstruction standards. Obstruction marking and lighting are recommended. This site does not exceed any existing instrument minima, or any plans on file for future instrument operations.

The Federal Aviation Administration, Eastern Region proposes to establish a permanent RADAR site for the ASR-11.

LOCATION: Northwest of Clarksburg Regional Airport, Clarksburg, West Virginia. This site is 12,150 feet northwest of the threshold area of Runway 21.
