A Study for establishment of Airport Surveillance Radar (ASR-11), Aeronautical Study Number 04-AEA-0164-NR, Binghamton, New York.

PROPOSAL: A Study to construct an Airport Surveillance Radar, ASR-11 at the Greater Binghamton Airport, Binghamton, New York. This is known locally as Site # 1 located on the northeast corner of the airport.

This structure does exceed airport obstruction standards. Obstruction marking and lighting are required. This site does not exceed any existing instrument minima, or any plans on file for future instrument operations.

The Federal Aviation Administration, Eastern Region proposes to establish a permanent RADAR site for the ASR-11.

LOCATION: On Greater Binghamton Airport, Binghamton, New York. This site is 825 feet northeast of the threshold area of Runway 16.

Any comments should be made in writing and based on aeronautical fact.


